The Executive Director of the Program for the Improvement of Non-Criminal Justice Services, Rodolfo Albán Guevara, highlights the execution during the year 2021 and the support provided to three institutions that are part of the justice administration system in the country: the Constitutional Court, the National Board of Justice and the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights.

In the words of the Executive Director, the realization of nine (09) meetings of the Steering Com-

mittee of the Program during 2021 has evidenced not only the capacity for coordination between the Institutions involved, but also the possibility of view the progress made in each of the presentations before the World Bank.

The commitment to continue contributing with the improvement of the justice service in the country has been strengthened, and in this latest edition of the year we present the balance of the objectives fulfilled and projections for the year 2022.

What is the balance of the Program that leaves the year 2021?

Very positive in several dimensions. From compliance related to World Bank standards, national standards and procedures. Intense activity in the disbursement requests to execute our portfolio of projects and achieving equipping and generating capacities in the Constitutional Court, JNJ and in the MINJUSOH.

What was the most important objective achieved in each of the projects? (MINJUSDH, TC and JNJ).

MINJUSDH Project:

The development of the Training Plan for the personnel of the General Directorate of Public Defense and Access to Justice of the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights, as well as the completion and approval of the Architectural Drafts and

Technical Files for the conditioning of the ALEGRA and MEGA ALEGRA centers.

Constitutional Court Project:

The acquisition of Computer Equipment was managed to improve the technology park of the Constitutional Court, which are detailed below.

- Intel Xeon Silver Server
- Switch 24G 1-slot + Tranceiver 40G QSFP + MPO SR4 + Module 1QSFP + Module 40GbE + Module 2 - port Stacking
- Red Hat Enterprise Linux Server Operating System Software Subscription o Equivalent + 5-year support

National Board of Justice: Approval of the Equivalent Documents of the project was carried out; As well as, the delivery of courses within the framework of the project began, such as specialized training in Penetration Testing and training in digital transformation. All in order to start managing the change towards a new service delivery model.

3. What is next for 2022?

MINJUSDH:

- The inauguration of 6 headquarters of the

ALEGRA centers

- Acquisition of equipment for the adequate conditioning of the ALEGRA centers.
- Continue with the development of the Training Plan for the personnel of the General Direction of Public Defense and Access to Justice.
- Development of an online microform digitization system.
- Preparation of the Equivalent Document for the development and implementation of an optimal information and communication technology system.

Constitutional Court:

- Acquisition of a 10KVA UPS solution with 4 hours of autonomy + Air Conditioning Solution + Extended warranty + 42 U Cabinet.
- Training in the use and administration of Oracle Database 11.2 AD.
- Development of the Equivalent Document of stage II, III and IV.

National Board of Justice:

- Acquisition of equipment to update the institution's computer park.
- Acquisition and updating of software for the institution.
- Continue with the development of staff training.

How much progress has been made in terms of interoperability with the institutions benefiting from the Program?

In order to achieve the automation of processes that allow achieving the implementation of interoperability, within the framework of the Investment Project "Improvement of the TC service provision model to achieve the proper im-

plementation of the EJE”, with CUI No. 2412543 the hiring the consultancy “Elaboration of a logical model that includes the necessary legal procedures and conditions so that the Constitutional Court can build a semi-automatic proposal for a presentation, based on demands, appeals, norms, jurisprudence in cases of Habeas Data”, which will allow have a jurisdictional knowledge base, flow charts, decision trees, among others, necessary to meet the current demand for processes and increase the predictability of the Constitutional Court. This consultancy is currently in preparation for its second deliverable.

Additionally, the consultancy will be hired “Implementation of a computer application so that the Constitutional Court can build a semi-automatic presentation proposal, with procedures and logical information based on demands, appeals, norms, jurisprudence in habeas data cases” which will allow to increase the functionalities of the computer systems and thus meet the current demand for processes and increase the predictability of the Constitutional Court. This consultancy is in preparation of its first deliverable.

At the same time, coordination has been maintained with the General Directorate of Criminological Affairs of the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights, so that the actions carried out in the Program within the framework of the execution of the projects are reflected in the National Interoperability Plan of the Justice Administration System, which is being updated by said Directorate.

How satisfied has the World Bank been with Executing Unit 003 and everything that has progressed this year?

The World Bank is fully satisfied with the development of the activities carried out by the PMSAJ, all of this is seen in the presentations made in the three (3) IBRD supervisions by the Executive Directorate, Project Plans and Studies Unit, and the Project Monitoring and Supervision Unit in the months of March, May and October, as well as in the two (2) virtual missions carried out in the months of March and October, and the holding of nine (09) meetings of the Steering Committee of the Program during this year

We are committed to contributing to the improvement of the justice service in the country. Citizens should feel the benefits of the justice system and the role of the PMSAJ and the team that makes up this highly specialized executing unit is essential for the achievement of the program’s objectives.

The Program started in October 2020 and lasts 5 years. It consists in implementing, through two executing units, a loan contract signed between the Peruvian Government and the World Bank for US\$85 million. Its purpose is to achieve the modernization of the Peruvian justice administration system in its NON-CRIMINAL stage. The institutions involved are the Constitutional Court, the Ministry of Justice, the Judiciary, the Judicial Academy and the National Justice Board.

As coordinator of the executing unit that attends the National Justice Board, the Constitutional Court and the MINJUSDH , it should be said that in this

short term progress is already visible, not only in pre-investment studies, which most of them have been completed, but also in significant advances in the execution of investments. It is mainly applied to the diagnosis and design of processes and in the improvement of the technological infrastructure.

The greatest goal for all the entities, that shape the justice system, is to digitize every processes in order to enable greater efficiency, security in the procedures and a significant reduction in the time of service. All this is related to the logical and wise premise **JUSTICE THAT IS NOT PROMPT IS NOT JUSTICE.**

Another major goal to achieve is the INTEROPERABILITY among all the institutions that shape the justice system, so that, the necessary process of communication and consultation among institutions can be done in a digital, safer, faster and more reliable way; and, can obtain statistical information that allows building a process of continuous improvement among all the stakeholders. This implies the integration of domains such as organizational, semantic and technical domain, so that, process modeling is compatible among institutions. In this way, the precise meaning of the information and data exchanged must be understood unambiguously in order to accomplish compatibility in integration.

The year 2022 will be a period of huge satisfaction in the Program progress since the definitive

investment processes are enabled with all the effort deployed during 2021, in terms of REGULATIONS that regulate and standardize data exchanges; GOVERNANCE of the program and the necessary coordination between its executing units that are already regulated; and, TECHNOLOGICAL TOOLS enabled in some cases and in the process of being enabled in others, will allow the advance jointly with the needs of digital transformation.

In the year 2022, we will also notice, in a very accentuated way, the development of Change Management processes, thought of the Human Resource as the basis of any effort in this process. Incidentally, the webinars developed in this sense during 2021, which were very successful, allowed us to design a very aggressive Knowledge Management for all stakeholders. We are on the right track.
