EXPERT SYSTEM FOR THE RESOLUTION OF HABEAS DATA CLAIMS IN THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT



The prototype test for the expert system in Habeas Data cases of the Constitutional Court was successfully completed. The final test of the system was carried out with officials of the Tribunal's Special Affairs Committee, who expressed their satisfaction with the results, since it will be

of great use to the entity. The technological application for the resolution of Habeas Data in the Constitutional Court will allow to obtain a proposal for the judges and their advisors. Once the file has been studied, a few questions will be answered about it, and with the project, a more predictive justice will be achieved.



COMPLETION OF THE FIRST WORKSHOP ON THE INTEGRATION OF OPERATIONAL PLANS

The members of the Executing Units UE-003-MINJUSDH and UE-002-PJ of the Improvement Program of the Justice Administration Services - EJE NO PENAL, held a virtual meeting to present their operational plans (AOP) with the aim of integrating the work being deve-

loped by both Executing Units responsible for providing technical and financial assistance to five institutions that are part of the justice system in Peru: the Constitutional Court, the National Board of Justice, the Judiciary, the Academy of the Magistracy and the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights.

FIRST WORLD BANK MISSION MAKES WORKING VISIT TO PERU



World Bank officials led by Carolina Vaira, senior specialist for the Public Sector in Latin America and the Caribbean, held coordination meetings with representatives of the beneficiary institutions of Executing Unit 003 of the Eje No Penal Program: National Justice Board, Constitutional Court and the General Directorate of Public Defense of the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights.

The purpose of these meetings was to analyze the progress of each of the projects financed by the World Bank under the loan agreement signed with the Peruvian government. A work agenda was also established to promote interoperability among the institutions that make up the Peruvian justice system.



NATIONAL BOARD OF JUSTICE TO HAVE AN INTEGRATED VIDEO SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

Improvement Program of the Justice Administration Services - Eje No Penal managed and financed the acquisition and installation of a closed-circuit television (CCTV) system for the headquarters of the National Justice Board located in the district of San Isidro. With an investment of more than nine hundred thou-

sand soles (including installation, training and maintenance), the National Justice Board will have this system to safeguard its physical files and avoid losses. As it is known, the institution has been carrying out the process of document digitalization within the framework of the implementation of the Electronic Judicial File EJE.

In October 2022, the Steering Committee of the Eje No Penal Program, chaired by the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights was carried out. The stipulated agenda included the presentation of progress reports on the execution of the projects of Executing Unit No. 002-PJ, which

serves the Judicial Branch and the Academy of Magistrates, and of Executing Unit No. 003-PM-SAJ, which executes the projects of the Constitutional Court, the National Justice Board and the General Directorate of Public Defense of the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights.

MEDIA TRAINING WORKSHOP FOR DISTRICT DIRECTORS OF THE ALEGRA CENTERS



As part of component 4.2 of the MINJUSDH Project, the Improvement Program of the Justice Administration Services - Eje No Penal organized a media training workshop for the district directors of the ALEGRA and Mega ALEGRA centers that operate nationwide.

For three consecutive days, 14 district directors

received an intensive workshop on communication strategies, crisis resolution and reputational image. The live interview technique allowed the officers of the Public Defense Directorate to be interviewed in order to see themselves “in the moment and live stream” and thus they could note their successes and points for improvement.



VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE WORLD BANK VISITS MEGA ALEGRA CENTER

On a working trip to Peru, Carlos Felipe Jaramillo, Vice President of the World Bank for Latin America and the Caribbean, visited the Mega ALEGRA center in downtown Lima to learn about the refurbishment works that will soon begin at this site, within the framework of the Improvement Program of the Justice Services - Eje No Penal.

This year, the World Bank is financing the rehabilitation of 05 of the 39 centers that operate nationwide so that people can be served in better conditions and thus bridge the gap in access to justice. It is estimated that the investment will exceed one million soles for the centers located in Villa María del Triunfo, Santa Anita, Villa El Salvador, San Juan de Miraflores and downtown Lima.

MINISTER OF JUSTICE APPRECIATES DELIVERY OF EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS BY THE EJE NO PENAL PROGRAM

At the headquarters of the Ministry of Justice, a ceremony was held for the delivery of equipment and material for the General Directorate of Public Defense. A total of 470 computers, 30 scanners, 104 psychological evaluation instruments, printers and stabilizers were awarded.



The World Bank, through the Eje No Penal Program, has been providing the ALEGRA and Mega ALEGRA centers with technological infrastructure as part of an ambitious project that seeks to improve the services they provide to the most vulnerable population.



SECOND WORLD BANK MISSION

For the second time in 2022, World Bank officials led by the senior specialist for Latin America and the Caribbean, Carolina Vaira, arrived in Lima to hold working meetings with the two Executing Units that make up Improvement Program of the Justice Administration Services - Eje No Penal. Officials from the Constitutional Court, the National Justice Board and the General Directorate of

Public Defense of the Ministry of Justice attended the Program's offices. Dr. Luzmila Adriansén, General Director of Public Defense thanked the Bank for the intervention through the Program and highlighted the beginning of the refurbishment works in five ALEGRA free legal advice centers. In addition, the use of containers was proposed for the creation of more ALEGRA centers nationwide.

WORKSHOP ON SPOKESPERSONSHIP AND EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION FOR THE OFFICIALS OF ALEGRA CENTERS.



In November 2022, a Workshop on Effective Spokespersonship and Communication was organized by the Eje No Penal Program for officials and representatives working in the Ministry of Justice's ALEGRA and Mega ALEGRA free legal advice centers. Thirty-four officials from the Ge-

neral Directorate of Public Defense were trained on topics such as public and political communication, journalistic interviews, television interviews and the importance of correctly articulating a message. To understand communication as a tool to disseminate and improve public policies.



IMPROVEMENT WORKS ARE STARTED IN FIVE ALEGRA CENTERS

In the facilities of the Mega ALEGRA center located in Lima, the work area for the beginning of the improvement service of this center was awarded. The Eje No Penal Program - World Bank will invest more than S/ 194,000 (one hundred and ninety-four thousand) soles for the improvements in this Mega ALEGRA center. The refurbishment works consist of: insta-

llation of glass partitions, enlargement of the conciliation area, painting, informative and safety signage, among others.

Work also began on the San Juan de Miraflores, Villa El Salvador, Villa María del Triunfo and Santa Anita centers. The EJE NO PENAL Program will invest more than 1 million soles in the first 5 ALEGRA centers.
