LLAPANCHIKPAQ: BRINGING JUSTICE CLOSER TO ALL

On September 29, 2023, the seventh edition of the National Simultaneous Fair Llapanchikpaq Justice 2023 was held with great success, a nationwide event that aims to provide free legal services to people in vulnerable situations. The fair, which was held simultaneously throughout the country, was organized by the Permanent Commission on Access to Justice for Persons in Conditions of Vulnerability and Justice in your Community, in collaboration with the district commissions of all the Peruvian Courts.

Commitment to the Community

During the inauguration, Supreme Judge Inés Tello Gillardi stressed the importance of Peruvian judges reaching out to the community to understand their needs and demands in order to provide an effective response. Tanja Goodwin, manager of the World Bank's Equitable Growth, Finance, and Institutions Program, highlighted the importance of the Electronic Judicial File and its complementarity with initiatives such as itinerant justice and the Alegra free legal assistance centers.



Patacancha: An Example of Cultural Diversity

This year, the fair was held in the picturesque town of Patacancha, located in the district of Ollantaytambo, province of Urubamba, in the Cusco region. Patacancha is a Peasant Community of the Quechua ethnic group, recognized with RD No. 101-96-DRA-RI, and located about two and a half hours from Cusco. With a population of 414 inhabitants, of which 197 are men and 219 women, according to the last 2017 National Census, this Quechua-speaking community is an example of the cultural diversity of our country.

Justice Closer to the Community

At the Llapanchikpag Justice Fair, the Integrated Model of Itinerant Justice, financed by the World Bank, was presented. This model aims to bring justice closer to the neediest and remote populations of Peru, complementing the free legal assistance services offered by the ALEGRA centers and other public and private organizations. In addition, the project involves providing technological tools and a specific regulatory framework to improve the efficiency of itinerant justice.

Quality Legal Services

In the prelude to the fair, we worked together with the World Bank's Program Manager to coordinate the participation of the ALE-GRA centers in such an important event for Peru's rural communities. Carolina Vaira expressed that "since the beginning of the implementation of the program we have worked with MIN-

JUS and the Judicial Branch to ensure that these two institutions complement each other and coordinate efforts to bring more and better justice services to the most remote and needy communities in the country. Through these types of fairs, and also by expanding the number of ALEGRA centers to be able to reach remote indigenous communities using

an intercultural approach, this objective is being met." During the Fair, the team of ALEGRA centers of Cusco attended to 432 people, including adults and children, exceeding initial expectations. The most consulted subjects were Alimony, Custody and Domestic Violence. In addition, 450 kits containing notebooks, pens, information leaflets in Quechua and Spanish,

among others, were distributed. The presence of a team of public defenders Quechua facilitated communication with the local population in their mother tongue. The children also participated through games and workshops, and learned a little more about other authorities and officials. human rights.

Investment and Areas for Improvement

The estimated investment to carry out these refurbishment works amounts to more than four hundred thousand soles (S/ 400,000). The areas contemplated in the work plan to be improved include the reception, meeting room, waiting room, children's area, tutoring room, conciliation hearing room, archive room, among other essential spaces.

Impact on User Experience: The refurbishment seeks to provide a modern and functional environment that will have a significant impact on the user experience at the ALEGRA center of Rioja. Upon completion of the work, those seeking the services of a free public defender will be served in completely renovated facilities, guaranteeing quality legal defense for the benefit of the population.

Commitment to Access to Justice



This important population preserves its cultural and linguistic traditions, as most of the inhabitants speak Awajun as their mother tongue. The indigenous communities of Bajo Naranjillo, Alto Naranjillo, Shampuyacu and Alto Mayo are located in the province of Rioja, specifically in the district of Awajún, one hour away from the ALEGRA center of Rioja.
